netball cancer challenge

your local oncology family...

amelia nalder, 4 years...

Amelia was a very happy and precocious 3 year old in July 2007 when we took her to her local Doctor to find out why her stomach was starting to grow. She enjoyed going to Day Care and playing with her friends and older sister Sophie who had just started school that year. Our Doctor sent Amelia for a CT scan the next day and the following day he explained to us that Amelia had a rare form of liver cancer, Hepatoblastoma, and that we needed to go The Children's Hospital at Westmead immediately to confirm diagnosis and start treatment. We were terrified to say the least. Amelia did not look sick and her only symptom was a stomach that continued to grow on a daily basis. We later found out that the growth was a tumour that finally measured 11 cm x 10cm x 9cm.

We travelled to The Children's Hospital at Westmead, where her condition was confirmed, she had a biopsy and a Central line inserted and began 9 months of treatment. Amelia would need to have chemotherapy and an operation to remove the left side of her liver, arteries, veins, gall bladder and lymph nodes. After her operation she would also need more chemotherapy.

Amelia started chemo on July 27th 2007 and immediately had severe side effects. She was constantly vomiting, had high fevers and her hair fell out. She lost over 25% of her body weight and had to have a nasal gastric tube inserted to feed her. She eventually needed to be nourished through TPN which is delivered via her veins. She had kidney problems, mouth ulcers and insomnia, but throughout all of this she kept her sense of humour and the chemotherapy worked in reducing the size of the tumour.

On 18th October 2007, Amelia underwent a 6 hour operation to remove the tumour and affected areas. The operation was successful

and she was up and running around 10 days after. She began more chemotherapy 2 weeks after surgery and her last round of chemo was given on 12th February 2008. Amelia's last day in hospital was March 20th 2008.

Since her discharge from hospital Amelia has had 2 cancer free scans and is now in remission. She is starting to return to a normal life of a 4 year old and will hopefully be beginning Pre-School soon. We have moved back to Aberglasslyn and are settling back into life living with her 6 year old sister Sophie who had to live with her grandparents throughout treatment. Sophie is also learning how to live with her mum and sister again after such a long separation.

Cancer has affected Amelia's hearing and she is mildly to severely deaf. She wears hot pink hearing aids and will need speech therapy. However, in the great scheme of things this is minor.

Throughout this journey as we call it now, Cure Our Kids and other groups have provided support and assistance to our family. From food in the hospital ward kitchens to a friendly face to listen and help, it truly makes a difference when you are struggling. We can't thank them enough.
